Model IQAC with Accreditation Support for Un-Accredited Institutions

I. Introduction

The information available on the NAAC portal, as on 19.05.2023, reveals that out of 1113 universities, 43796 colleges, and 11,779 stand-alone institutions, only 430 universities and 9257 colleges have been NAAC accredited. It is quite evident that the accreditation rate is under 30 %. HEIs without accreditation need hand-holding to attain quality benchmarks for getting accreditation as well as enhancing standards. University of Kerala attempts to handhold HEIs in the State through a model IQAC.

As far as Kerala is concerned, the state has about 16 Universities of which the accreditation status is as given in the table below. There are about 1345 colleges, out of which 290 colleges are accredited.

13 colleges and one University (University of Kerala,) in the state have been accredited with A++ Grade by NAAC. Besides, 23 colleges and 3 Universities have attained the A+ grade. Further, least 41 colleges have been given A grade by NAAC. However, it is noteworthy that majority of the HEIs are Self-financing Institutions and their accreditation status is below 10 %. Improving standards of education would mean addressing this segment and promoting Better education through self-financing Institutions along with the Government and aided streams

II. Focus Area - Accreditation of Non-Accredited Institutions & Improving Accreditation

University of Kerala is accredited with 'A++' grade with a grade point of 3.67 in 2022 and is ranked 24th in NIRF in 2023. Being the mother University in the state, University of Kerala proposes the following initiative under the focus point "C. Accreditation of Non-Accredited Institutions & Improving Accreditation".

Model IAQC Supporting Unaccredited HEIs

IQAC, University of Kerala is hand holding and supporting unaccredited institutions in their quality initiatives to secure accreditation. The major support undertaken in the past include support under the *Paramasrh* scheme of NAAC through the mentor, Mar Ivanios College, Thiruvananthapuram. IQAC has supported the accreditation process of 12 unaccredited colleges of which 5 are in rural area.
