and Languages need to be strengthened. Resolved to organize a workshop on research publications in high end journals. The 2-day workshop would have one day for guides and one day for scholars.

Item No.XIII.19: Distribution of masks and functioning of health centre

Biju Kumar, Vice-Chairman,CSS to coordinate on the same.

#### **Objectives**

- 1. Cultivating good habits and practices leading to healthy living and better understanding of societal needs
- 2. Encourage savings and thrift among teachers, staff and students through avoiding wasteful expenses and prioritizing spending
- 3. Identify and help students of UOK who have been badly affected by the COVID19 pandemic
- 4. Provide financial support to such students and their families considering the urgency of the case
- 5. Link Students in need to the Intervention Mechanisms of the University or State (Counseling Centre, Health Centre etc)

#### **Operation**

Maintain a Voluntary Depository at the IQAC office, entitled UOK POST COVID DEPOSITORY.

The Depository to have two parts:

Part A: Practices and suggestions relating to 1 and 2 in the objectives –BETTER LIVING

Part B: Voluntary financial contributions-GREATER CARING

Teachers, Staff and students can drop their small savings in cash or cheque voluntarily, deposit their practices on reduction in wasteful expenses, good habits and practices that emerged from the Post COVID 19 Experiences (Focusing on food , Immunity Diet, Relationships, team work, etc.) relating practices to financial savings that might have resulted.

The box would also seek voluntary donations from within and outside the University

#### NOTE TO THE IQAC

Sub: - Transfer of Ph.D Programme from University of Mysore to University of Kerala in r/o Smt.Anna M., Research Scholar in Political Science- Reckoning of Coursework already done - reg.

The Syndicate at its meeting held on 30.04.2019 vide Item no.08.90.A12, considered the request received from Smt.Anna M. for the transfer of her Ph.D Programme from University of Mysore to University of Kerala and resolved to agree with the request, subject to the conditions laid down in Clause 5.8 in "Regulations for award of Ph.D Degree, University of Kerala 2016", if she is otherwise eligible for being registered for Ph.D Programme in University of Kerala. Hence, she has been permitted to join at Dept. of Political Science, University of Kerala and continued her research under the guidance of Dr.Shaji Varkey, Professor, Dept. of Political Science, University of Kerala. Before granting the transfer of her Ph.D Programme, the Doctoral Committee held on 28.02.2019 examined her Ph.D Proposal and has forwarded the remarks that the candidate had successfully completed the coursework in 2017 for which she had produced a certificate from ISEC. But, it is not specified that, whether the coursework done at the ISEC, Bengaluru can be reckoned for doing research at University of Kerala. Considering the request of the candidate to issue her registration order without any further delay, the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor has ordered to grant her Ph.D registration subject to reporting to the Syndicate and to place the matter of reckoning the course work before the IQAC with the remarks of Dean and Doctoral Committee. Accordingly, Smt. Anna M. has been granted transfer of her Ph.D Programme and University Order was issued regarding the same. And, the remarks from the Chairman, Doctoral Committee and the Dean, Faculty of Applied Sciences have been sought on the matter of reckoning the course work.

The Chairman, Doctoral Committee has forwarded his remarks that, the candidate has successfully completed the Ph.D course work at ISEC with seven papers spread over two semesters. And, the said course work is on a par with that of University of Kerala (Political Science). The Dean, Faculty of Social Sciences has remarked that, her coursework maintains very high academic standards and fulfils the requirement for Ph.D work as per UGC norms. And the course work for Ph.D in ISEC is equal to the course work for Ph.D in Political Science in Kerala University. Both the Chairman, Doctoral Committee and the Dean have recommended that, her Ph.D coursework at ISEC may be reckoned for doing Ph.D at University of Kerala. The remarks of both along with the marklist of the course work examination passed by the candidate at ISEC are appended herewith for ready reference.

As per the orders of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, the matter of reckoning the course work done by Smt. Anna M. at ISEC along with the remarks of Dean and Doctoral Committee is forwarded to IQAC for remarks in the matter.
