## **Item No. XXII.04: Converting the Centre Technology and Resource Centre for Malayalam (TRCML) into a teaching department**

**Dr. S. A. Shanavas, Hon.Diretor, Technology and Resource Centre for Malayalam has submitted a proposal for converting the Technology and Resource Centre for Malayalam into a Teaching Department named Department of Computational Linguistics.**

*Proposal for Department of Computational Linguistics*

*The existing centre - Technology and Resource Centre for Malayalam TRCML, which was established in 2006 November on the occasion of the Malayalam day observation, may be converted to a fledged department named Department of Computational Linguistics. This conversion is necessitated due to the emergence of Computational Linguistics as a professional course and the subject attaining independent status and also because of language technology advancements. Language technology personals are very much in demand in ICT market and trained Computational Linguistics are obligatory to develop language technology initiatives. Also for making devices based on natural language based practical applications, like such as Machine learning, Machine translation, Speech-to -texts, and Text to speech system, Informaton retrieval, text/opinion mining, etc.*

*Computational Linguistics is the most commercially viable branch in the information era; hundreds of companies in the country and outside work on computational linguistics. Computational linguistics work for high tech companies, creating and testing models for improving or developing new software in areas such as apeech recognition, grammar checkers, dictionary development and more. Computational linguistics also work in research groups at universities and government research labs. Computational linguistic teach subjects such as semantics, computational semantics, syntax , models in linguistic phonetics and phonology. It also offer sociolinguistics, psycholinguistics, corus linguistics, machine learning, applied text analysis, grounded models of meaning, data – intensive computing for text analysis and information retrieval.*

*TRCML was established in 2006 November, on the occasion of the Malayalam day observation. The centre has completed two major research projects funded by the UGC and the KSCSTEE, Govt of Kerala, on corpus development and corpus based lecion. The centre also worked as co-investigatior with the Centre for Translation Studies for another UGC project on Online Bilingual Dictionary Development. The centre also made possible to conduct Refresher Course on Language Technology through Academic staff College. The Centre has conducted many seminars and other programs on the topic and conducted ten day training for language teachers, techocrat, linguistics and computer science/ IT students/ experts. In the Current year two projects have got sanctioned to TRCML and planning to be started soon after getting formal university order.*

*Two courses are already been sanctioned by the University in previous year budgets on Computational Linguistics*

- 1. Master in Computational Linguistics (MCL programme-2 year PG)-2011-12**
- 2. Diploma in Malayalam Language Technology (one year)-(2017)**

*The same course could not be started because of the lack of separate space, teaching faculty, Board of Studies, and some other reasons, which are required to be fulfilled for the Centre.*

*The Mphil Programme in Computational Linguistics is already going on and same is the case with PhD Programme in Computational Linguistics. Five PhDs have already been produced in Computational Linguistics and four are going on. Proposal for the establishment of the Department*

##### **Request from Head, Department of Computational Biology and Bioinformatics**

Sub:- Reimbursement of publication charges through IQAC – Reg.

I write this with reference to publication charges of the research scholars of the Department of Computational Biology and Bioinformatics. Our department has been doing modest research and achieved modest publications, in reputed international journals with impact. As you are well aware, many of these journals now charge for publishing in their pages as per the open access publication model which has become very popular. Due to this, our research students have to face a new challenge of remitting publication charges to the tune of one to two lakhs. I enclose herewith four publications in recent times from our department. The charges for these have been remitted by the concerned students (totalling of Rs. 5,05,747/-). The students are constantly requesting for a help from the University for reimbursement to meet these charges because it is a huge amount for them. I would like to point out that these publications are very important for the standing of our University because these publications are counted in our NIRF ranking and NAAC accreditation and Chancellors Award and therefore it would be most appropriate that the University supports these students with these publication



charges. I understand that the IQAC has a provision to meet the publication charges and therefore I request you to consider reimbursing. The following publication charges which have been remitted by the concerned students. The full details as enclosed have been placed before the DDC on 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2022 for due consideration and the committee has endorsed the request for reimbursement.

The funding is from State Plan Fund for Conduct of Hybrid Programmes.

**For Conducting UGC NET Coaching class Organized by Researchers Students Union**  
**in association with IQAC**

**Introduction:**

The National Eligibility Test (NET) is a test to determine eligibility for college and university level lectureship and for award of Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) for Indian nationals. It aims to ensure minimum standards for the entrants in teaching professions and research. On behalf of the University Grants Commission (UGC), the National Testing Agency (NTA) holds the test for determining the eligibility of Indian nationals for the Eligibility for Assistant Professor only or Junior Research Fellowship & Eligibility for Assistant Professor both in Indian universities and colleges.

The researchers Union, University of Kerala would like to initiate a Six-Month crash course for the UGC NET coaching for upcoming sessions in Dec 2021/June 2022 sessions.

**Objectives**

The main objective of the scheme is to prepare Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Minority Communities candidates for appearing in UGC- NET/JRF or SET so that enhance number of candidates to clear the examination

- a) Improve the academic skills and linguistic proficiency of the students in various subjects.
- b) To raise their level of comprehension of basic subjects to provide a stronger foundation for further academic work.
- c) To strengthen their knowledge, skills and attitudes in such subjects, where quantitative and qualitative techniques and laboratory activities are involved, so that, the necessary guidance and training provided under the programme may enable the students to come up to the level necessary for pursuing higher studies efficiently and to reduce their failure and dropout rate.
- d) To provide career guidance and psychological counseling for capacity building to those who are in need of such counseling.
