

### **Proposal**

### **Objective**

University of Kerala is dedicated to discovery, generation, development, communication, and application of knowledge in a wide range of academic and professional fields. With a view to expose students, teachers and researchers of our University to the learning and research environment prevailing in institutions of repute (Indian & Global), IQAC proposes create opportunities to listen to Nobel laureates and similar personalities of eminence. Such experts would interact with our scholars and enrich them in their learning and research activities.

The IQAC has already conducted the Travel with Nobel Laureates programme with considerable success. The present proposal is to invite recommendations from various departments to invite specific personalities, either physically of online, for lectures and interaction. Considering the uncertainty due to the possibility of another wave of Covid 19, we propose to have 5 to 7 actual visits and around 10 online talks.

# Facilitating Action Research through Social Intervention – Sustainable Development Interventions in selected Gram Panchayats by University of Kerala

Recent discourses with regard to sustainable development understand lack of agency as the root cause of an alienated population in every country, further reinforced by the epistemic injustice embedded in welfare schemes that undermine people's agency and knowledge to decide on issues in their own lives. Mainstream economic development programs that follow top down approaches to development fails to recognize the context specific needs, and discards the societal knowledge systems that positively impacts quality of interventions in social sectors, especially in governance, health and education systems. To deal with the deepening crisis relating to unequal development, reflected as disparities in health, education and quality of governance in different regions, sustainable development and equity-based social interventions that follow action research principles are needed, which quintessentially requires fine-tuning the process of knowledge creation and dissemination through participatory and transdisciplinary approaches using horizontal networks in the society.

Against this backdrop, the project envisages social interventions in selected Gram Panchayats, with the participation of students, to bring about sustainable development initiatives focusing on social sectors, following action research pedagogy. Indicators will reflect qualitative enhancement in education, health, and governance, and thereby evolve into co-created pedagogy for intervention packages among rural communities. The action research project aims to develop a culturally sound intervention process using action research pedagogy, which can be replicated in other rural areas, and thus contribute towards policy recommendations relating to participatory approach to sustainable development.

The process essentially involves the following possibilities of societal interventions, such as i) mobilizing community members in selected intervention area ii) imparting sector and non-sector specific skills to catalyze the community to become active participants iii) incorporating vision of community in molding intervention strategies in specific sectors iv) developing and implementing an innovative, sustainable development model based on action research principles

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with ramifications in educational, health and governance systems, and v) formulating an action research strategy for rural communities, based on the social interventions.

### **Objectives:**


The project follows a locally need-based, socially-relevant intervention strategy to attempt sustainable development in selected Gram Panchayats, using action research techniques, with the participation of students.

This include,

- 1. Conduction of baseline survey in selected Gram Panchayats to explore the quality of health, education and governance sectors and to identify intervention areas.
- 2. Mobilizing and training community members to perform social audit in the Panchayat with the support of student volunteers.
- 3. Working along with palliative care team to serve the needs of community and initiate interventions in health sector
- 4. Creation of a mentoring team to mentor students in the community, so as to address issues related to poor quality of education, mental health issues and post Covid traumas.
- 5. Formulation of an action research protocol to intervene in local communities, based on the outcome of social interventions made.

### Methodology:

The project adopts a multi stakeholder, transdisciplinary, action-oriented methodology to fulfill stated objectives. The research component of the project includes three Action research programs (Knowledge Systems, Resource Management, Sustainable development initiatives) to be conducted in community. The conceptual framework depicts the action plan, research and intervention outcomes, and impacts of the project in selected Gram Panchayats.



The project will be based on action research conducted in rural community, selected by the project team purposively in order to include representation of economically, socially and culturally backward Gram Panchayat. The project will adopt a cyclical iterative process of knowledge co-creation where at each phase, the process of project will be evaluated and feedback at each stage will inform the design of the upcoming stage. The project is envisaged as having five phases.

- Phase 1: Identifying and Mobilizing Community members: mobilizing community
  members to build civic awareness among people and empower them to become change
  agents.
- Phase II: Base line survey: conducting a baseline survey and initiating Community
  Based Participatory Research in assessing physical, human and natural resources of the
  community.
- Phase III: Plan and initiate intervention: implementing the action plans developed based on the base line survey report and thereby initiating interventions in governance, health and education.

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- Phase IV: Transformative Knowledge (Action research protocol): refining the process of intervention based on experiential learning and refining education, health and governance systems.
- **Phase V: Action research report and monitoring**: evaluating experiential learning, and to sustain the interventional model adopted in each hamlet.

### **Deliverables:**

Research Outcomes include: Reports including,

- 1. Pre-Assessment Report of Gram Panchayat (resource survey report)
- 2. Sustainable Development Action Plan for Gram Panchayat
- 3. Social Audit Report
- 4. Action research Protocol (based on intervention experience in the community)
- 5. Final Project Report

Intervention Outcomes at community level include:

- 1. Resource and Knowledge mapping of Panchayat
- 2. Conduction of Social Audit in Panchayat
- 3. Improved health and education systems palliative care to old age people and mentoring program for students.
