It was also resolved that follow-up mails shall be issued to members of committee Nos. 32 and 38. It was further resolved that "Save Energy" "Save Water" posters may be issued, Dr. Bushra agreed to take the lead in this.

Q3.15.05: Research Student Survey:

As per the decision Q3.13.25, a Research Student Survey has been done and their report will be tabled before the IQAC for approval. It is hoped that the survey will throw light on the research practices of the students and point out issues and problems faced by them.

Decision: IQAC appreciated the survey report. It was resolved that all Depts. libraries and Kerala University Library and Campus Library be issued hard copies

Q3.15.06: <u>University Departments - Open Day</u>

Dr. Bushra Beegom, member, IQAC has proposed that the university may conduct a Visit day/Open day programme for attracting the best students to the concerned department as most of them are not aware about the possibilities after their Higher Secondary Education and Post-Graduation. In this programme the faculty members may explain the courses they are handling, research in which they are engaged at present and what kind of impact they have done so far in their respective areas (publications and engagement with society). This could be recorded and uploaded in the website. Student representatives (two senior students in the Department in each course) are also to do some presentations. Every faculty member should explain to the audience about how the particular subject is suitable and useful to the students. And a campus tour may be conducted in the afternoon.

A typical programme Schedule is given below:-

• Registration 9.30 - 10.00 am

- 10.00-10:10 am Welcome Note by the Head of the Department: 10 minute (Introducing himself/herself, courses research activities, their collaborations with other universities, research projects,)
- 10.10- 10:20 Snapshot lectures of every faculty members in the department (15-20 minutes for each faculty) time based upon the number of faculty members in each department)
- Refreshment. (each department has to arrange)
- Placement Data (include the name and description with salary)
- Student experience (One from each course): 5 minutes only
- Campus Tours.

IQAC may consider the above proposal.

Decision: Director, IQAC was authorized to take steps to implement the open day.

Q3.15.07: Department Level Alumni Association

Alumni activities are going on in most teaching departments. However, large scale Alumni activity is absent in the University as a whole. IQAC has taken effort to compile a list of prominent alumni of all teaching Departments (more than 1000 names have been collected). It is proposed that a meeting of all the Alumni be organized in the University Senate Hall and an Alumni Association may be formed at the University Level for all Teaching Departments together. (Proposed name: <u>University Teaching Departments Alumni</u> Association: "UniTeD Alumni"). 2017-18 budget has provided Rs. 2 lakhs for alumni activities and hence IQAC may decide further action.

Decision: Director, IQAC was authorized to put up proposal for implementing the idea.

Q3.15.08: Cost of Education (per unit):

Per-unit cost of education is a figure sought by both ranking agencies and Govt. from time to time. A proper research is required to define and calculate it. It is proposed that Dept. of Economics may be entrusted with this task.

Decision: IQAC agreed to the proposal.

Q3.15.09: Format for Certificate of Appreciation:

IQAC meetings have made many decisions on issuing of letters of appreciation to faculty and students for innovation, excellence and achievement. It is now proposed that a standard certificate be printed and used on such occasions. The proposed design is given as Appendix A3.

Decision: IQAC suggested some changes and the revised certificate is appended as Appendix A3.

Q3.15.10: Online Data Entry:

The computer center has designed and implemented an online data capturing system based on the data dockets introduced last year by the IQAC. Online data capture is a suggestion that had evolved during the first meeting of the IQAC itself and finally has been realized. It is hoped that IQAC activities including preparation of AQAR, and various study reports will be greatly benefited by the new online system. The drudgery caused by the repeated call for data will also be mitigated by the new system. IQAC may note and advice further action.



Decision: IQAC noted the progress and observed that it would go a long way in documentation of academic activities. It was decided that certificate of appreciation be issued to Dr. Vinod Chandra and Sri. Johnson of KUCC, for the successful implementation

Q3.15.11: Status of Patenting:

Master action plan (MAP) for Quality Improvement of University of Kerala has identified enhancement of patenting as an area of focus. The aim is to gradually raise the rate of patenting to around 5 patents per year. Even though the patenting has not reached 5 patents per year, it is noted that there is steady increase in patenting in the University. The following table is presented before the IQAC:

Q3.15.12: Outreach Activities: Action proposed by designated committee:



University level committee for Extension Activities has met twice after the formation and made proposals for accelerating outreach activities. The minutes of the first and second meeting of the ULC are appended as Appendix A4(a) and A4(b). The committee also conducted a pilot home visit to the home of a school student of the Govt UP School at Karyavattom. IQAC may consider the proposals drawn up by the committee and approve action. 2017-18 budget has provision for enhancing outreach activities.

Decision: IQAC commented the initial activities and proposals for school adoption and centralized outreach activities in addition to Dept-level activities were approved for implementation. It was also recommended that local Residents' Associations may also be covered in the outreach.

Q3.15.13: <u>Innovation Contest:</u>

As follow up of earlier IQAC decision, a poster designed for innovation contest is enclosed as Appendix A5. IQAC may approve.

Decision: IQAC approved the proposal for implementation...

Q3.15.14: Green Squads:

IQAC had proposed a green charter in 2014 (which, along with other policies and charters, has now been approved by the syndicate for placing before the Academic Council). It is observed that many functions organized by the Departments continue to flout the charter, perhaps due to lack of awareness about the same. It is therefore proposed that Depts. may be asked to form Green Squads and the members of the squad may be given a brief awareness programme and be entrusted with intervention related to implementation of green charter. It is proposed that a poster (given as appendix A6) may be circulated.

Decision: IQAC approved the proposal.

Q3.15.15: Report on Innovation Portfolio in UCE:

The University College of Engineering has produced a report titled "Innovation Portfolio in UCE" which will be tabled. IQAC may note the same and consider further action.

Decision: IAQC resolved to issue certificate of appreciation to UCE and resolved further that an innovation portfolio of University Departments be compiled

Q3.15.16: Report on Annual Researchers Survey:

The Annual Researchers Survey was completed and the report is tabled for consideration by IQAC.

Decision: Withdrawn

Q3.15.17: NIRF Ranking of University of Kerala:

The NIRF, an initiative of MHRD, Govt. of India to rank Higher Educational Institutions in India, has announced its rankings for 2015-16 on April 3, 2017 and the University of Kerala

is ranked 29th in whole of India among Universities and 1st in Kerala. This is indeed a matter of great achievement for the University system and its stake holders. The Master Action Plan adopted by the IQAC in the beginning of the this cycle had prioritized visibility in the State, National and International rankings. Having won the first Chancellor's award at the state level, the national level rankings reconfirms the march of the University in quality and excellence. The results of International rankings (THES) is awaited. In rankings of leading national publishers (Week and India Today) also our University ranks first in Kerala. Decision: IQAC resolved as follows: (i) IQAC places on record its appreciation of the efforts taken by Dr Shaji Anirudhan, Dr. Vinod Chandra S.S., Dr Anil Chandran S; Smt. Raji Leela, and Smt. Deepthi G. for their excellent efforts in NIRF data compilation and uploading. Certificates of appreciation may accordingly be issued. It was also noted that the office of the Vice-chancellor supported the activity efficiently. (ii) It was resolved that the Vice-chancellor may write a letter of appreciation to all faculty members for the achievement of top ranking from Kerala.

Q.3.15.18: Chancellor's Award:

University of Kerala came second in the Chancellor's evaluation for the best University in the state. In the previous year, the University was ranked first. Many of the data submitted by the University were not accepted during the verification by a team of officials, which seems to be the reason for the change from last year's position. A team consisting of Dr. Shifa, Dr. Binoj, Dr. Darwin and Director IQAC had led the voluminous compilation of data with inputs from all HODs. This is brought to the notice of IQAC.

Decision: IQAC places on record its appreciation of the efforts taken by Dr Shifa, Dr. Binoj, and Dr. Darwin, in data compilation and presentation for the Chancellors Award. It was resolved to request the Vice-chancellor to take up the matter of data submitted by the University being cut down, arguably in an arbitrary manner.

Q.3.15.19: <u>Setting up UGC-NET/JRF and Soft Skill Collections in Department Libraries:</u>

It is proposed that departments may be advised to set up UGC-NET/JRF collection in the department libraries, keeping together books related to the same in a visible manner and also notifying the same in the notice boards and email groups. Additional titles/volumes may be

acquired after seeking suggestions from students. Similarly, a collection on Soft Skills may also be set up. This may include books on Communication Skills, Time management,. Thinking Skills, Creativity, Critical Thinking, Globalization, Introduction to foreign languages such as German, Arabic, Japanese, Chinese and French. Both English` and Malayalam books may be acquired. Suggestions for both students and teachers and experts may be taken. IQAC may consider.

Decision: IQAC approved the proposal.

Q.3.15.20: <u>Industry sponsored research (Tata Steel):</u>

Dr. S.M.A Shibli has been awarded a industry sponsored research project for Rs. 11 lakhs for "Development of Anit-fouling Galvanised Coating on IF (Interstitial-Free) steel". This involves incorporating nano oxide particle in the galvanized coatings through hot dip process. The funding is from Tata Steel Ltd, Jamshedpur. The MOU has been signed in 1st March 2017. This important industry linking is brought to the notice of the IQAC.

Decision: IQAC noted the development as an important one involving consultancy and technology transfer. It was recommended that certificate of appreciation be issued accordingly.

Q.3.15.21: Performance of Depts and Institutions in University Youth Festival, 2017:

For this second time in a row, the University Departments bagged the third place in the Kerala University Youth Festival with 77 points. Aparna S. Anil of Institute of English has also won the coveted Kalathiklakam title. In addition, UIT and KUCTEs have also bagged one prize each. This commendable student achievements in cultural arena is brought to the notice of IQAC. The final points table is as follows:

Appendix A1: Report on International Seminar on 'Quality of Research'.



An International Seminar on 'Quality Research' was organized Quality Assurance Internal Cell. University of Kerala on 13th February 2017 at the Darwin-Babbage Hall, Department of Computational Biology Bioinformatics. The seminar was inaugurated by Prof. E.P. Madhava Bhattathiry, former Nobel Prize Committee member and

the function was presided over by Dr. Baboo M. Nair, Professor Emeritus, Lund University, Sweden. Dr. Achuthsankar S. Nair, Director, IQAC gave the welcome address and Dr. Ashalatha S. Nair, Director of Research felicitated the event. 86 registered participants from various departments in the University and nearby research institutes participated in the seminar. A short interactive session with Dr. Bhattathiry was arranged, in which the participants were keen to know the challenges faced by Dr. Bhattathiry during his research tenure and the difference between past and present approaches towards research. A panel of eminent scientists including Prof. P.R. Sudhakaran, Former Dean, Faculty of Sciences, University of Kerala, Dr. Baboo M. Nair and Dr. Gangan Prathap, Outstanding scientist, NIIST, Thiruvananthapuram presented their views towards improving the quality of research in Indian universities. The talks covered the various factors that influence research like passion, imagination and creativity of researchers. In the evening session, Dr. Amruth G. Kumar, Associate Professor, Central University of Kerala addressed the different critical questions that researchers should ask themselves to bring out the best research output. The final talk by Dr. D. Benjamin, former Head, Department of Malayalam, University of Kerala was a thought provoking session from the angle of arts and humanities, with emphasis on the importance of data collection, organization and framing of methodology in research related to literature. The seminar concluded with remarks from Dr. Baboo M. Nair on the diversity of research ideas put forward by the speakers and finally feedbacks were collected from the participants.



The meeting began at 12 noon at the Dept. of Computational Biology. Director, IQAC presently holding the charge of Co-ordinator, presented the backdrop of the IQAC decision to form the ULC Committee. The draft action policy was also discussed in the meeting. Each member expressed their opinion regarding problems and prospects in enhancing the extension activities. After detailed deliberations and discussions following recommendations were arrived at:

- 1. A compilation of possible extension activities aimed at school children from all departments may be made. Each committee member may contact the department head concerned and collect this information and communicate the same to the Co-ordinator i/c, who shall produce a poster/document that can be sent to schools, after presenting before the IQAC.
- 2. The Director, IQAC presented the profile and self-study report of the Govt. UPS Karyavattom prepared by him. After detailed discussions, considering the background of the students and proximity to the campus, it was resolved that Karyavattom UPS shall be a main point of outreach as it is a Govt. School, near to the campus. It is also suggested that the HoDs may send a faculty/research scholars to visit the school for a primary survey.
- 3. It is suggested that the outreach activities may be conducted, school wise or with participation from many departments, so that one full day can be effectively utilised for the visiting school students. The committee members can coordinate such programmes by allotting specific time for each department. While formulating the activities care may be taken to see that the programme is beneficial to the students and should be short but motivating activity.
- 4. It was resolved that the DPI, SSA Director, RSMA Director etc. may be contacted to seek support for programs similar to INSPIRE/INCULCATE etc. and also a "Little Scientist/Scholar" programme for attaching students to faculty.
- 5. It was resolved that a map of immediate locality of Kariavattom campus may be made and institutions, residence associations etc. in the region be identified for possible collaboration in extension activities.
- 6. Ultimately departments may selectively turn their project and research towards the immediate locality and provide useful inputs to the Local Self Government.
- 7. A small proposal may be submitted to the University for financial assistance.
- 8. It is suggested to organise an open house, once in year, involving all departments, for the school and college students as well as public.
- 9. It is resolved that HoDs may document and keep records of all the activities, with a small write-up, notice and photographs. The documents may be submitted to the IQAC for compilation.

The Meeting came to an end at 1.00 PM.



Appendix A7. Report of Kerala University Curriculum Fair 2017 Jointly organized by Curriculum Development Centre, UoK & IQAC, UoK on MARCH 15-16-2016



"Kerala University Curiculum Fair 2017" was organized under the joint auspices of Curriculum Development Centre, University of Kerala and IQAC, University of Kerala. Altogether, 42 posters articulating curriculum innovation which showed clear roadmap to encourage educators to defy the conventional norms and think outside of the box to reach all types of learners with individualized styles were presented in the Fair. Dr. Asha J.V, Hon.Director, Curriculum Development Centre was the Co-ordinator of the programme. This report compiles the proceedings, participants list and the posters. It is expected that the report would trigger wider participation in coming years.

The posters presented in the Curriculum Fair-2017 generally provided strong support for students' social development. The entries in the Fair-2017 depicted blueprints of opportunities to work collaboratively, in pairs and in groups, and to develop the skills of teamwork and leadership. They also had rich opportunities for discussion and debate, often with representatives from the wider community and business. This was more than an academic exercise, since many of the posters illustrated ways to tackle real issues with real people. The Fair-2017 witnessed pockets of innovation sprouting up across the educational landscape. But our universities continue to keep at arm's length in democratizing imperative of "giving voice" to the innovative ideas. The Curriculum Fair-2017 was in letter and spirit a platform for showcasing the reality that curriculum implementation is the reaction between the teachers, learners and other stake holders in education geared towards achieving the objectives of education. The Fair-2017 was also a platform which corroborated the academic insight and strength of the faculty of Kerala University departments to translate their idea into a workable blueprint and to develop program for it successful implementation.

The Curriculum Fair was designed for two days. Posters representing innovative ideas were invited from Teachers of Universities, Colleges and teacher education institutions sufficiently early. Forty two entries in the form of Posters were received for the Fair. All the posters were arranged on the Senate Hall Stage in a systematic way.

The inauguration of the Fair began with a prayer followed by the welcome address delivered by Dr. Asha J.V., the Hon. Director of the Curriculum Development Centre, Dept. of Education, University of Kerala. It was followed by a key note address by Prof. Achuthsankar S. Nair, Director, IQAC & HoD, Dept. of Bioinformatics and Computational Biology, University of Kerala. Prof. Theresa Susan, Head, Dept. of Education chaired the session. The formal Inauguration of the Fair was done by the team of experts Prof. K.R. Sivadasan, Prof V.Reghu, Prof. K.Reghunathan Pillai and Dr. K.Gopalakrishnan stepped in to view the posters and interacted with the presenters. There was a non competitive evaluation using a tool developed for the purpose. Teams of student teachers from different teacher education colleges along with their Teachers visited the Fair. Besides, teachers, Research Scholars, NGOs, teachers and students from Arts and Science Colleges and University Departments viewed the exhibited posters. The exhibition lasted till 5.00 pm in the evening on 16-03-2017. All the visitors appreciated the conduct of the Fair. Local hospitality was provided to the participants of the Fair.
