



Editorial





Many new initiatives have been designed and/or launched: Kerala University Grand challenge, Innovation Contest, Internal Course Accreditation etc are ready to be rolled out. The first MOOC course is also ready to go online.Startup initiative, presently managed by IQAC, has also been fruitful in enabling four startup companies. Additio-

nal Skill Acquisition initiative is yet to roll out.

One of the major ground work done by IQAC this year has been the design and implementation of master data collection at Dept and Faculty level. This has been found extremely useful in not only meeting data needs of IQAC, but that of other Depts like Planning & Development or College Development Council. The compilation of the AQAR this year has been a very simple affair with no additional call for data.



IQAC Website redesigned





Master Action Plan

he Master Action Plan (MAP) to imiprove quality is a listing of 350 points classified under eight focal areas: 1. Vision, Frame Work & Benchmarking 2. Research & Innovation 3. Teaching, learning & Evaluation 4. Schools, Depts. & Centers 5. Student Development 6. Governance 7. Extension 8. Miscellaneous. They have been drawn up by considering the parameters recognized by NAAC and UPE scheme. In addition, the IQAC has also deliberated and contributed its collective wisdom. This document is expected to be the road map for the University in its journey towards excellence. At the end of 2016, 37% of items in MAP has been either initiated or completed.

Infrastructure Funds Promised



unding from Kerala Infrastructure Fund Board (KIFB) to the tune of ₹ 150 Crores will be made available to University of Kerala, to develop Karyavattom campuses to world class. This was declared by Honourable Minister for Finance, Dr. T. M Thomas Issac during the inauguration of the International Seminar on "Attracting Project Funding: Opportunities and Approaches" organised by IQAC on 20th August 2016. Dr. Thomas Issac called upon the University to develop a detailed project report for Karyavattom Campus development. He expressed satisfaction that the University was taking effort to attract external funding. He also declared support of Govt. of Kerala for the "Kerala University Grand Challenge" being launched by IQAC. Registrar Dr. M. Jayaprakash presided over the inaugural

function. The function was organised in collaboration with Translational Research Professional & leadership Centre (TPLC) at Barton Hill Engineering College under Directorate of Technical Education. Dr. K. Vijayakumar, Director of Technical Education, Dr. Shaji Senadhipan, Principal, Barton Hill Enginee-College, Dr. A. Shaji, ring Member of IQAC and Dr. Achuthsankar S. Nair, Director, IQAC spoke on the occasion. Two parallel sessions, one for Science & Technology and one for Social Sciences. Arts and Humanities were held. Close to 200 participants were there. 

Annual Student Survey



n annual student survey was conducted during the 2-tier induction programme for post- graduate students, organized by the IQAC in 2016. This was aimed at understanding the student cohort's social, academic, entrepreneurial, and aspirational background, so as to enable the teachers and administrators to serve them better. 81 questions were asked under 9 heads. The responses to these have been compiled and published. 458 students of the newly admitted batch have taken part, making it a fairly representative survey one. The annual conduct of this survey is expected to also provide an indication of changing social backgrounds and student population.



Lund University, Sweden, officially inaugurated the function. Dr. K. P. Jaikiran, Director FLAIR, Govt. of Kerala, presided over the function. Dr. Achuthsankar S. 

Team IQAC





Teaching & Learning | Academic Ideas for improvement




Audit




he report of the first Academic Audit of the University of Kerala has been brought out. It has been conducted as a faculty driven selfreflection and peer feedback. The Departments themselves have chosen peer reviewers and have resolved on taking steps based on peer review. The IQAC has merely been an enabler. It is that the perhaps noteworthy Kerala University Act provisions for a general audit of varsity's working, every 10 years, as per subsection (1) of section 71 of the Act. In 1984, Dr. Malcolm S. Adiseshiah and in 2000, Dr. Padma Ramachandran led the two commissions appointed by the Government of Kerala. The commission of 1984 seems to have conducted something very similar to the present audit of teaching Departments. Some extracts of both these reports have been included as an appendix to the present Academic Audit report. The exercise is to repeated once in every two years






the University of Kerala. Six eBooks have been released under Creative Commons CC-BY-NC-ND (Attribution - Non Commercial-NoDerivs) license. In the first phase, 10 books were received for consideration. An editorial committee consisting of Dr. S. Kevin(Former Pro-Vice Chancellor, Ibrahim, (Retd Professor of English), Dr. E.V. Sonia (Scientist)

Rajiv Gandhi) Centre, and Dr. John K. Kattakkayam (former Prof. of Sociology) reviewed the manuscripts received and recommended 6 for publication. They are available in IQAC website for download. AQAR of 2016 records e-Books as one of the best practices of University of Kerala. Many teachers have expressed interest to contribute eBooks in 2017.

MOOC: Ready for Rollout


fter almost an year of deliberations and technology evaluation, the first "Massive Online Open Course" from University of Kerala is ready for roll out in January 2017. A professional video has been launched and international sign up is being solicited at www.keralauniversity.ac.in/mooc. As it is well known that the dropout rate of MOOCs is exceptionally high, the University has designed its first MOOC with six lectures, each of six minutes. The course subject has also been chosen to appeal almost every one-"how to make powerful multmedia presentation".

In 2016, the University tested a pilot MOOC, for which a number of teachers from within the University signed up. This enabled the testing of the technology and also provided




valuable feedback for the design of the first course. IQAC is co-ordinating the first MOOC. The MHRD, Govt. of India has meanwhile launched a MOOC platform named SWAYAM and has started offering UG courses through it. The facility for credit

transfer from SWAYAM courses has been legislated by UGC. The Academic Council of University of Kerala has readily adopted the regulation in 2016. MOOC has come to stay, and the University of Kerala has set the wheels rolling.



ifteen years ago, the University of Kerala attempted simple form of MOOC. It announced an online course on "Web Technologies" in April 2002. While the discussions and interactions were online, the video lectures were to be delivered on CDs! (The internet did not have the capacity to carry online video during 2002). Three students registered for the course too. But due to many reasons, the course did not take off. The tryst with MOOCs is being realized, after 15 years, in a fully online mode and in an international canvas.

What should our University research on?



he University of Kerala has been accelerating its efforts to enhance quality in all spheres. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the University has taken multiple steps to invite suggestions from all stake holders of the University, from general public,

alumni, local and national Industries and organizations through direct communications, media releases and also using social media. These have now been compiled and published in IQAC website. It is published for the benefit of students & research scholars of the University. This compilation is important activity aimed at connecting research to real-life problems. Many of the problems highlighted by the proposers are worth first consideration by researchers, as their utility is automatic. Kerala Minerals and Metals has, for instance, pin-pointed their problem: that of developing means of using the two lakh metric ton of waste iron oxide and ETP (Effluent Treatment Plant) solid. The Innovation Lab of Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) has proposed a collection exciting technological problems. Many other organizations and individuals have made innovative suggestions such as synthetic blood to attract mosquitos, cocopistol to estimate tenderness of coconuts and so on.

Research Council



irector, IQAC held charge of Director of Research from June to December 2016. A full-fledged meeting of the Research Council was organised during this time. The minutes of the meeting has been published and includes a documentation of history and current status of research in University of Kerala.


The council adopted a mandate for itself and considered a status report of research in the University. The avarage impact factor of 2 for the 100 publications it produced in 2015 was noted as having scope for improvement. It was decided that scientific infrastructure should be documented. IQAC has produced such a documention and published it in IQAC web site. Other matters relevant to IQAC are being acted upon.

Research on the University

o promote and research work directed towards the University, such work has been issued letters of appreciation by IQAC. In 2016, two such letters were issued: (i) Dept. of Futures Studies has produced a project report on "Performance assessment of 100 KW solar power plant installed at University Campus in Kariavattom". (ii) Dr. Asha J.V., Dept. of Education has come out with a book on "Disabled Friendliness of Higher Education Institutions in Kerala: A case study of University of Kerala".



Gender Audit






Academic Calandar


